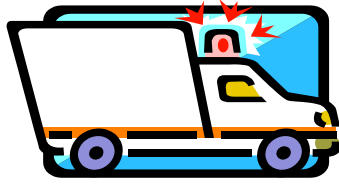

- **Sexual Assault:** This unit serves adults— inpatient and partial hospitalization, alcohol and drug dependency services, dual diagnosis inpatient care and intensive outpatient drug and alcohol services. Crisis/emergency services include urgent evaluations, domestic violence, sexual assault and rape treatment program.
- **Intensive Outpatient Program:** Intensive Outpatient Program provides short-term crisis stabilization and treatment for those suffering with psychiatric symptoms that significantly impair one's ability to function. It includes treatment for adult patients with dual diagnosis (a combined psychiatric and chemical dependency problem). It is an alternative to inpatient care and also is available as a followup to an inpatient stay.
- **Consultation/liason services:** Offers psychiatric assessment and evaluation for those receiving inpatient medical care at Doctors Hospital, Grant Medical Center and Riverside Methodist Hospital. Physicians may contact clinical nurse specialists at these hospitals to request a consult if you are under their care and suffering with psychiatric complications. A psychiatrist will then make an evaluation and treatment recommendations regarding psychiatric condition/s.
- **Inpatient Care:** Inpatient care is recommended when emotional, psychological and behavioral problems reach a crisis and there's a need for a safe environment to get patients stabilized. The psychiatric team evaluates the next most urgent treatment steps. Services may include medication management, group therapy and activities, further consultation and education. Inpatient dual diagnosis treatment is offered for adults with a combined psychiatric and chemical dependency problem.
